### Careful Cobbers up for sale

Part of Shepparton's history will go under the hammer tomorrow.

Seven of the city's beloved Careful Cobbers will be auctioned in Altona tomorrow by automotive auctioneers Manheim Fowles at 10 am.

The Cobbers, listed as "Go Karts" by the auction house, will go up for sale one at a time in a salvage auction, effectively separating the last of the fleet.

Now in varying states of condition, Manheim Fowles auctioneer Mark Harrison said there was no way to tell what price the colourful twoseaters would fetch.

"I've got no idea it's an auction so anything could happen,' he said.

Mr Harrison said he did not know who owned the Careful Cobbers.

Complete with painted-on faces and powered by small petrol engines, the Careful Cobbers were the cornerstone of a driver education and road safety program for primary school-aged children for almost 30

The program began in 1981 at Shepparton's DECA site and more than 250 000 students from across Victoria and southern NSW have taken part over the years.

The brightly coloured cars even "trained" Prince Charles and Princess Diana in the art of careful driving
